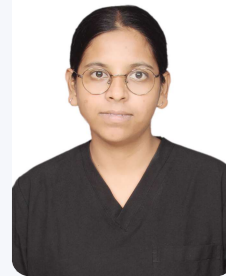

ZAB PRE-APPROVAL RECEIVED

Rajdeep and Yatin fly out in September.

Both have cleared ZAB pre-approval — the recognition authority's confirmation that their Indian nursing qualification will be assessed for German equivalence, and the last major gate before travel. Visa appointments are next, and both fly to Germany in September.

Language progress. Three full batches advanced a level this quarter — A1 to A2, A2 to B1, and B1 to B2, the point where employer interviews become realistic.

Nursing**OPEN**

Our largest pathway. German language training from A1 to B2, employer matching with verified German hospitals and rehabilitation centres, Section 16d recognition visa guidance and post-arrival support.

Ausbildung**OPEN**

Paid vocational training in Germany for candidates aged 18–25, with a stipend from the first day of training. 13 candidates entered the pathway this quarter through pre-screening and Conditional Offer Letters.

Physiotherapy**NEWLY LAUNCHED**

Now live, with enrolments coming in. Two physiotherapists in the programme are going for pre-screening rounds with German employers. Open to BPT and diploma holders with recent clinical experience.

PROSPECTIVE CANDIDATES

How long does it take from enrolment to flying out?

On average 18 to 20 months for Germany and 15 to 18 months for Austria, depending on how quickly you clear B2 — that alone takes 9 to 12 months at 2–3 hours of study a day. Documentation, apostille, employer interviews, the visa appointment and travel add another 6 to 8 months.

PROSPECTIVE CANDIDATES

What will I actually earn — year 1 versus year 5?

Year 1, during recognition, is around €3,000 gross a month. By year 5 it is between €5,000 and €5,500, with night and weekend allowances on top. Insurance, pension and 28–30 days of paid leave are included.

CURRENT CANDIDATES

How does recognition (Anerkennung) actually work?

Your Indian qualification is assessed against the German standard by the recognition authority. ZAB pre-approval confirms the assessment will proceed — the milestone Rajdeep and Yatin just cleared. After you arrive, an adaptation period covers whatever gaps the assessment identified. Your salary rises once recognition is granted, typically from year 2.

CURRENT CANDIDATES

What is the Kenntnisprüfung, and how do you prepare me for it?

It is the practical and oral exam that closes the gap between an Indian nursing qualification and the German standard. Candidates who clear their hospital interview now move into Pflege Deutsch — nursing German covering ward vocabulary, handovers, documentation and patient communication — so preparation starts in India, not after landing.

Before the interview. Candidates sit mock interviews with our trainers until the answers hold up in German.



Three stages, from A1 to the Kenntnisprüfung.

Clearing the hospital interview used to be where our language work ended. Pflege Deutsch, new this quarter, extends it to the knowledge exam.

Stage 1

A1 TO B2

Classroom German up to TELC B2 at our Delhi centre, five days a week — the level employers require before an interview is scheduled.

Stage 2

TELC B1 & B2

Sittings are booked as a batch, with mock exams and speaking practice beforehand. Ten candidates cleared a TELC level across May and June.

Stage 3

**NEW — PFLEGE
DEUTSCH**

Nursing-specific German for candidates who have cleared their hospital interview: ward vocabulary, shift handovers, documentation, doctor and patient communication — together with structured Kenntnisprüfung preparation, started in India so candidates arrive already familiar with the exam format.

Pflege Deutsch begins once the hospital interview is cleared and usually runs online, so Kenntnisprüfung preparation starts in India rather than after arrival in Germany.

That is the quarter. Our thanks to every candidate who sat an exam or took an interview — and to the families backing them.
